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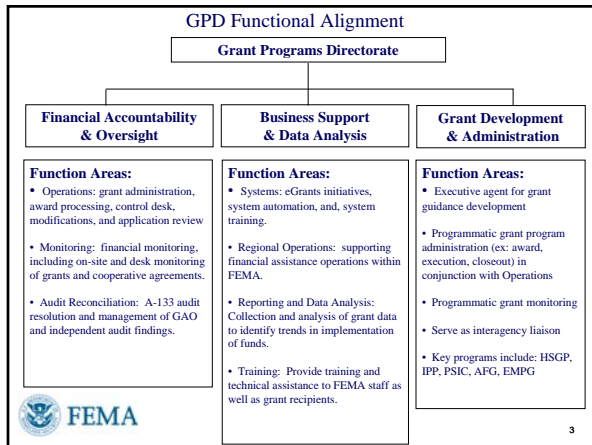

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State Administrative Agency (SAA)

- Each State and territory has a gubernatorial-appointed contact responsible for managing all GPD funds and associated program requirements
- The SAA should be the main point of contact as they are the initial recipient of all grant awards

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Local Jurisdictions

- Train, equip, and prepare first responders for WMD events
- Execute the State Homeland Security Strategy
- Review local expenditures to ensure compliance to specific grant guidance
- Ensure timely submission of required program documentation



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Preparedness Officer

- Serves as liaison between State Administrative Agency and the National Preparedness Directorate
- Serves as a strategic consultant to States by assisting in the identification of strategic goals and the implementation of preparedness programs
- Reviews activities to ensure compliance to specific grant guidance
- Ensure timely submission of required program documentation
- Most are located at FEMA HQs, but a few in the FEMA regions



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Regional Preparedness Officer

- Assist in the execution of general Preparedness Officer responsibilities
- For issues concerning Emergency Management Performance Grants (EMPG) and the Metropolitan Medical Response System (MMRS)
- For issues concerning Citizen Corps

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FY 2007 HSGP

State Homeland Security Program (SHSP)

- \$509,250,000
- Supports building and sustaining capabilities at the state and local levels
- Focus on prevention, protection, response, and recovery
- Provides funding to all 56 states and territories
- Funding is determined based on a combination of
 - A Congressionally-mandated formula,
 - Effectiveness in identifying proposed initiatives, and
 - Risk methodology



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FY 2007 HSGP

Urban Areas Security Initiative Program (UASI)

- \$746,900,000
- High-threat, high-density urban areas
- Assists in building and sustaining capability
- Focus on prevention, protection, response, and recovery
- Funding is determined based on a combination of
 - Effectiveness in identifying proposed initiatives, and
 - Risk methodology



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FY 2007 HSGP

Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Program (LETPP)

- \$363,750,000,
- Builds state and local law enforcement capabilities to prevent terrorist attacks
- Provides funds to support critical protection activities
- Provides funding to all 56 states and territories
- Funding to states and territories is determined based on a combination of
 - A Congressionally-mandated formula, and
 - Effectiveness in identifying proposed initiatives



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FY 2007 HSGP

Metropolitan Medical Response System (MMRS)

- \$32,010,000
- Assists designated metropolitan areas to sustain and enhance medical mass casualty preparedness and response
- MMRS is inherently multi-jurisdictional



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FY 2007 HSGP

Citizen Corps Program

- \$14,550,000
- Supports Citizen Corps Councils with efforts to engage citizens in
 - Personal preparedness
 - Ongoing volunteer programs
 - Surge capacity response
 - Participation in state and local preparedness exercises
- Provides funding to all 56 states and territories
- Funding is determined based on formula

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Allowable Equipment Categories

- Grantees may purchase first responder equipment in the following categories (number of categories has increased every year):
 - Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).
 - Detection Equipment
 - Decontamination Equipment
 - Interoperable Communications Equipment
 - Terrorism Incident Prevention Equipment
 - Explosive Device Mitigation and Remediation Equipment
 - Physical Security Enhancement Equipment
 - Medical Supplies/Pharmaceuticals
 - CBRNE Logistical Support Equipment
 - CBRNE Incident Response Vehicles/ Aircraft/Watercraft
 - CBRNE Search & Rescue Equipment
 - CBRNE Reference Materials
 - Agricultural Terrorism Prevention, Response & Mitigation
 - Cyber Security
 - Intervention Equipment
 - Citizen Corps specific equipment
